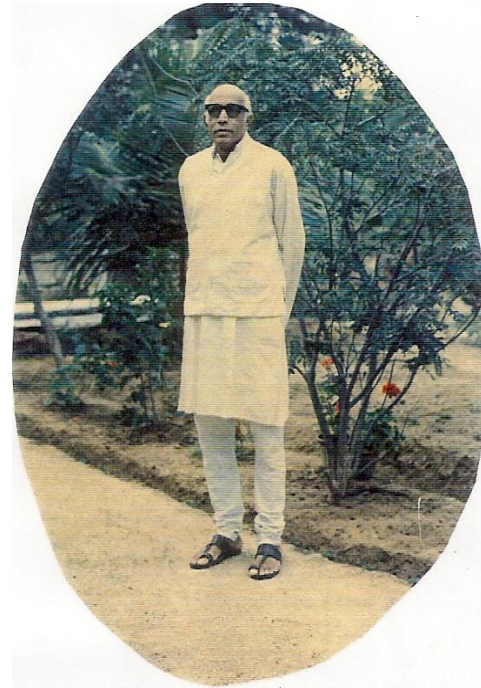

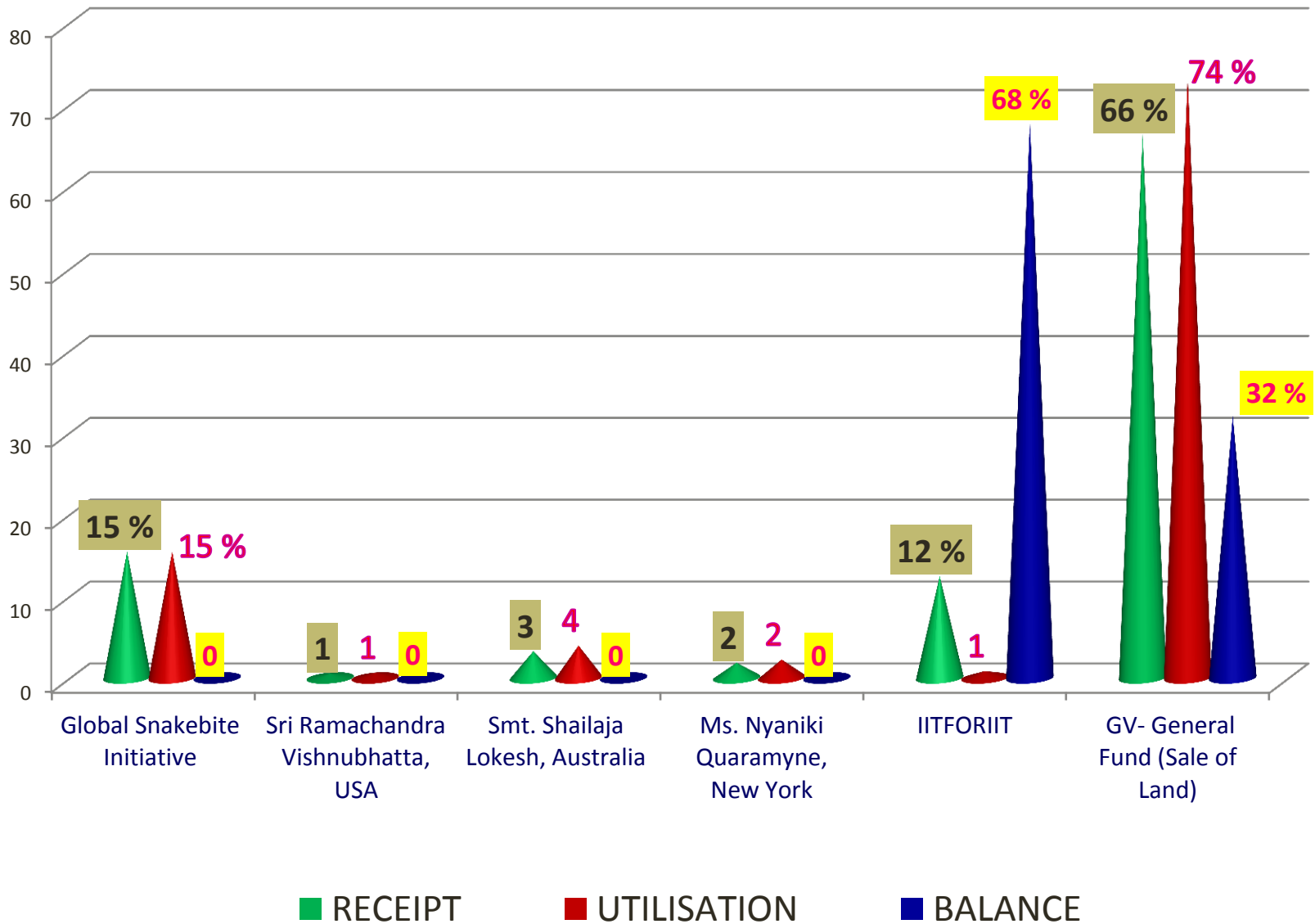

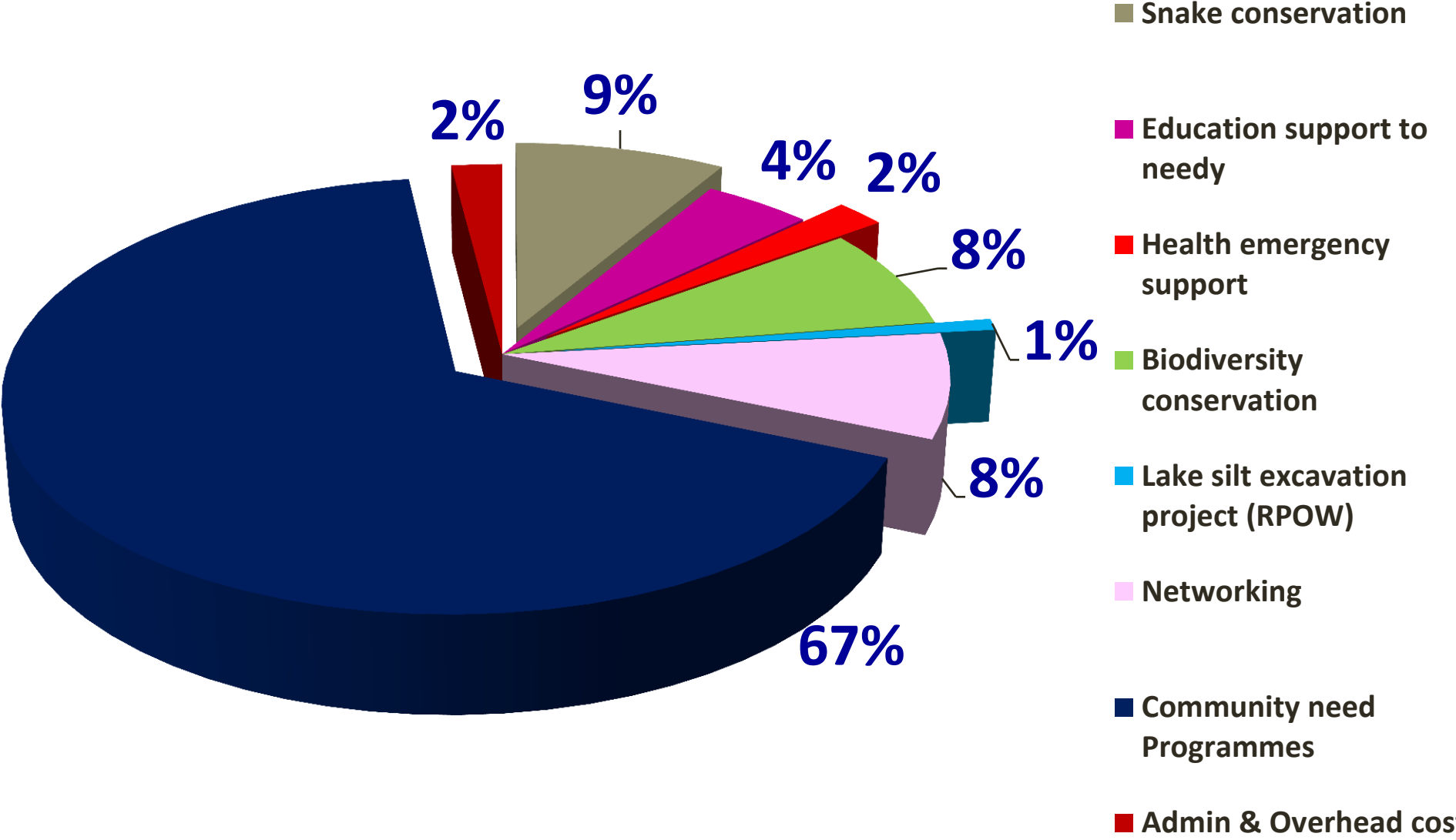

FCRA accounts UTILISATION



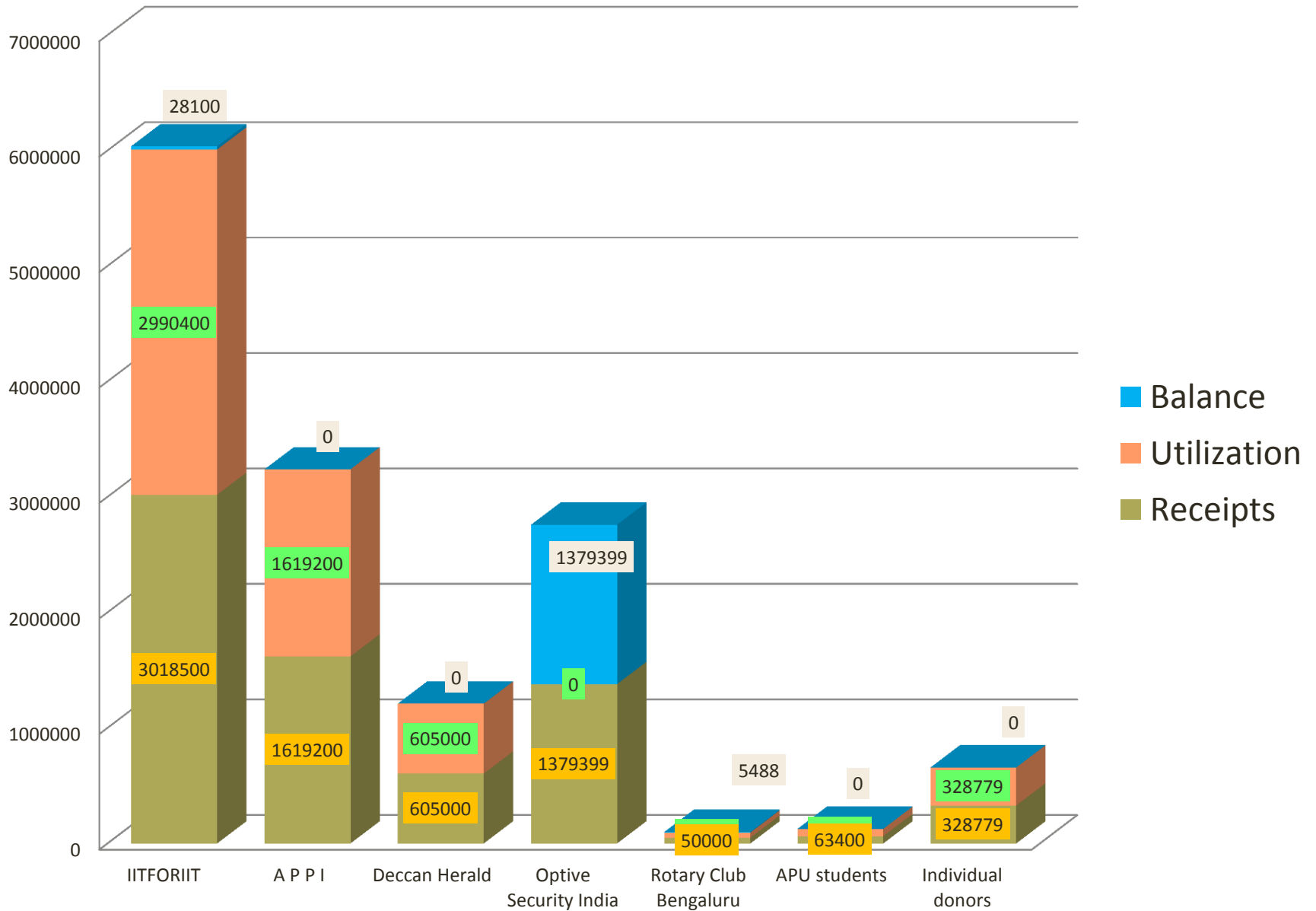

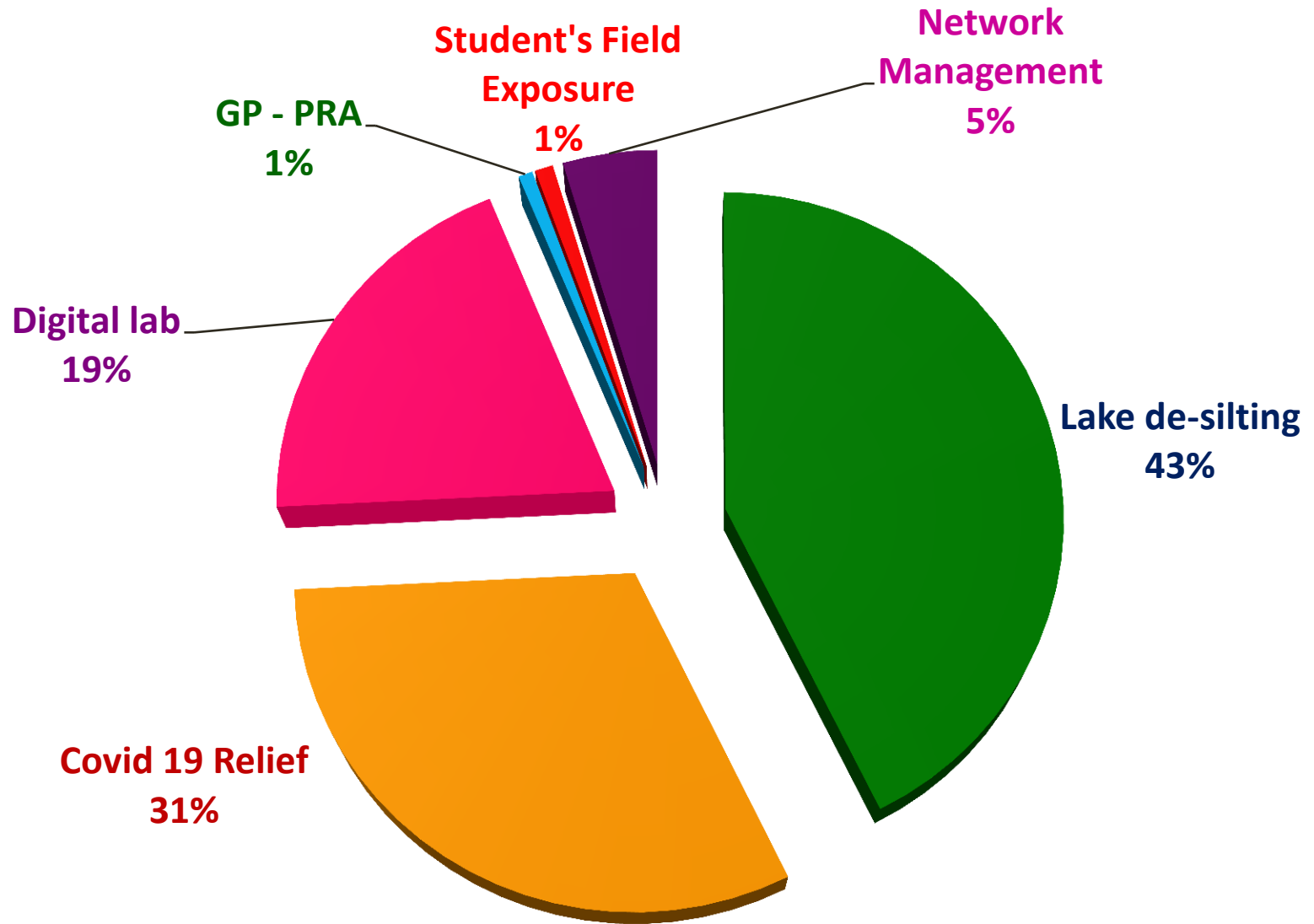

DOMESTIC Funds Utilization



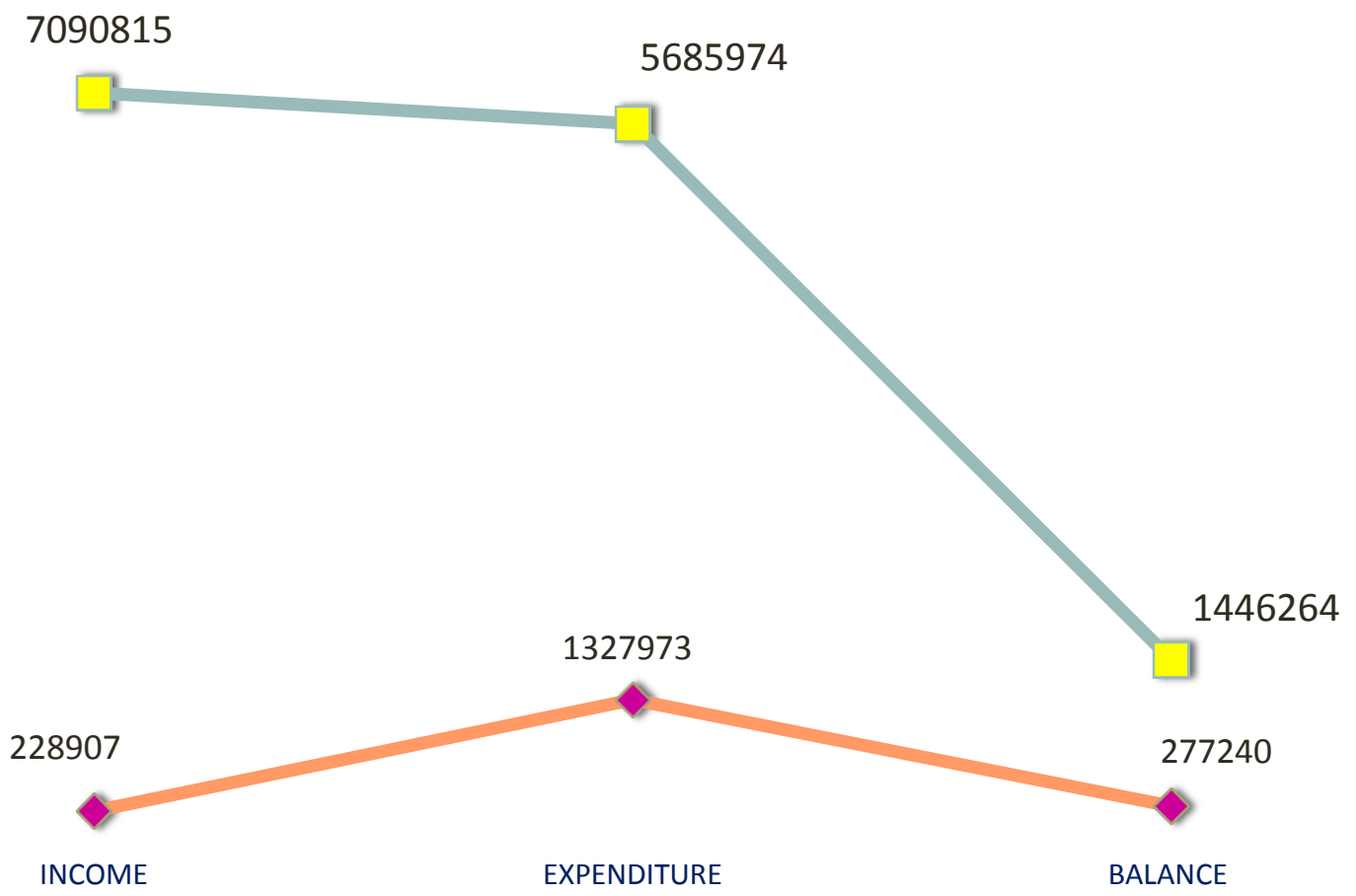
LOCAL FUNDS UTILISATION

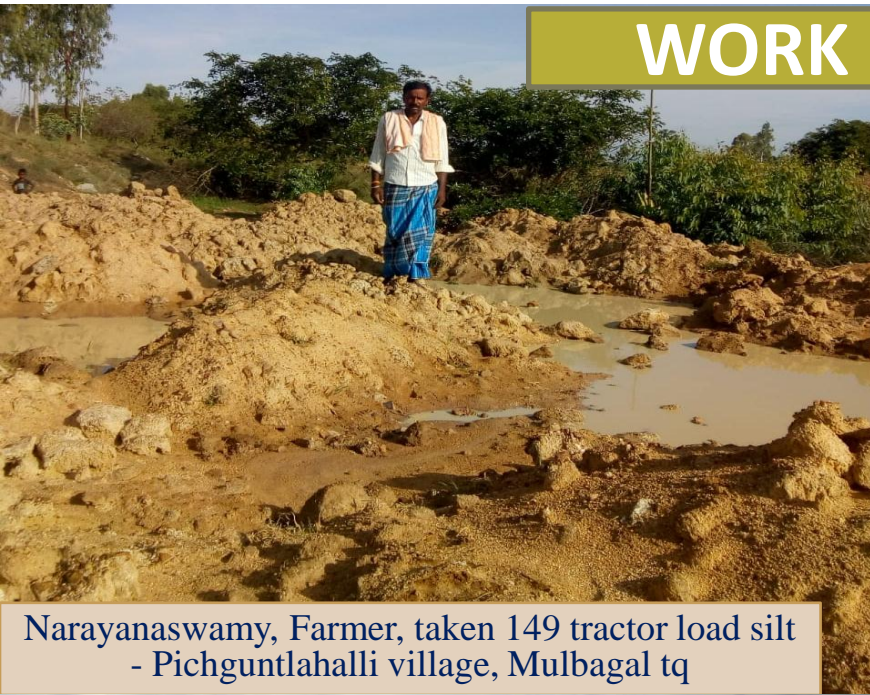

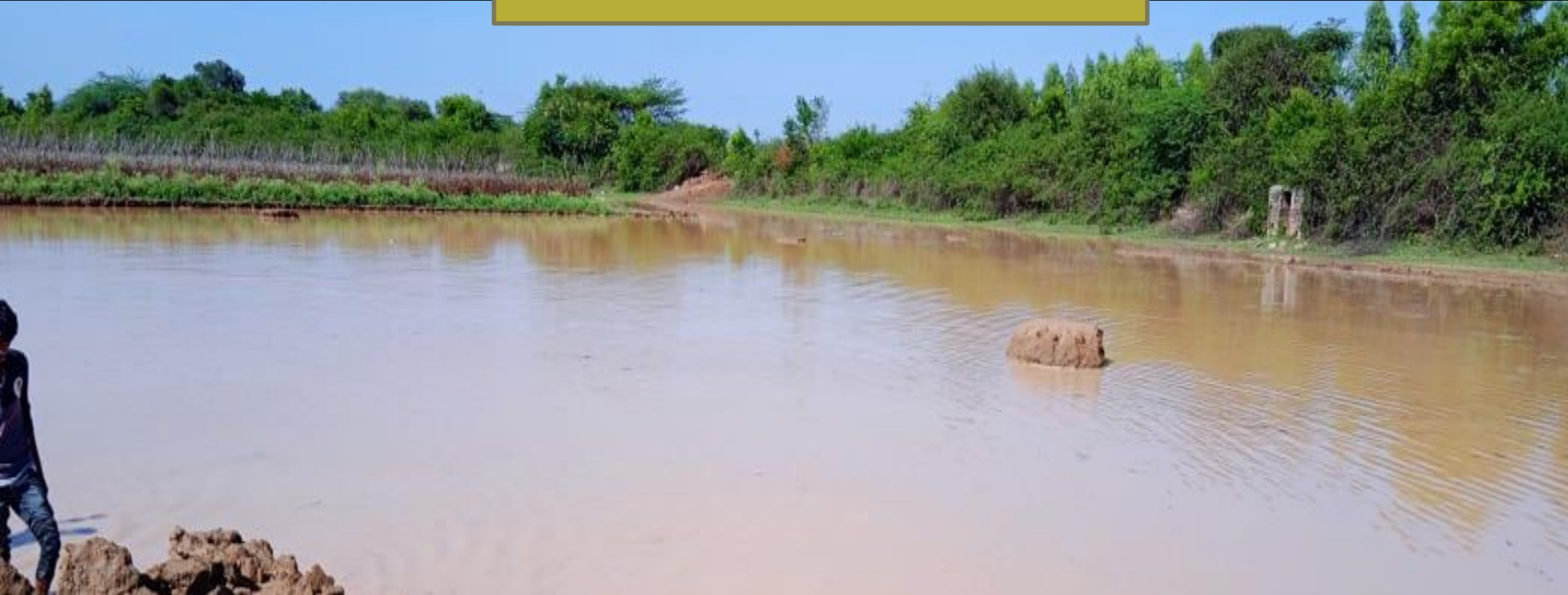
